Food	They eat <b>seafood, lamb</b> , and <b>turrón (a sweet treat)</b> .	They eat <b>roast turkey, potatoes</b> , and <b>Christmas pudding</b> .
Decorations	They use <b>nativity scenes (Belén)</b> and lights.	They use <b>Christmas trees, lights</b> , and <b>stockings</b> .
Santa or Kings?	Three Wise Men (Los Reyes Magos) bring presents.	Santa Claus (Father Christmas) brings presents.

- In **Spain**, there are big parades for the Three Kings on January 5.
- In **England**, people pull **Christmas crackers** with jokes and paper hats.
